
Pray for the Harasi People

The Harasis tribe is an isolated, Bedouin tribe living in the central desert of Oman. There are thought to be perhaps 5000 Harasis living in Oman today. They live in a large gravel desert plain that is extremely dry and hot during the summer months. This inhospitable area was not permanently inhabited until the Harasis arrived in the 19th century. Some Harasis have settled in small desert towns, particularly in the central town of Haima (Hayma).

The Harasis tribe speak their own language of Harsusi, an endangered Semitic language that is not understood by Arabic speakers. They are the most isolated tribe in Oman and pride



themselves in their independence. Modern technology has significantly impacted in Harasis life. Most families now use trucks and SUVs to move across the desert. Some men now hold skilled jobs in urban areas and speak Arabic. These men will work in the cities until the holiday season and then return to their central desert homes. Education is limited, although there is a boarding school for boys and a day school for girls in the central desert town of Haima.



The Harasis tribe follows the tradition of most Bedouin tribes and adheres to the religion of Islam. Little is known about their daily religious practices or beliefs. It is common for Bedouin tribes to follow Sunni Islam, although Sufism and animistic beliefs are also prominent among the Bedouin. There are no known Harasis believers in the Lord Jesus Christ.
