Oman is the oldest independent state in the Arab world. Most Omanis follow the more tolerant Ibadi sect of Islam. The people are very proud of their culture. Despite modernization redefining their lives, they hold tightly to their traditions, customs and conservative values. Increasing affluence and material comforts along with deep cultural and religious pride make Omanis resistant to the Gospel.

Their diversified economy includes oil production, agriculture and fishing, with considerable investment in health and education, especially for women. The number of college educated Omanis is growing rapidly and youth unemployment is a significant societal problem in Oman.

Almost all of the Christian population is made up of foreigners. But the Lord is building his church and in recent years a small number Omanis have become of Jesus followers.
